Worship Next Week: August 30 Ctrl + Click HERE to join worship next Sunday 10:30 a.m. In Romans 12: 9-21, named in some Bibles as "Marks of the True Christian," Paul writes a description of what the Christian life looks like. It reads like a list of instructions, and perhaps was written to offer advice to new Christians. In these exhortations, Paul calls the Christian community to put its faith into action. The imperative verbs give a sense of urgency to the community's calling. Exercising love, rejoicing in hope, overcoming evil with good – all go to the heart of what it means to be Spirit-led.

A "call to faithful living" is a consistent theme in the readings for this Sunday. Exodus 3:1–15 narrates Moses' call. It also serves as the call to the people of Israel to hope in God's promise of a secure future. In Matthew 16:21–28, Jesus calls both teacher and followers to discipleship.

In the last two generations, since the mid-twentieth century, much has changed in our society and the role of the church. TH SUNDAY PENTECOST

August 23, 2020

Exodus 1:8-2:10

Be Transformed

Shiphrah and Puah, midwives to the people in Moses' time, speak:

Shiphrah: A midwife helps women deliver babies. We bring pure, beautiful life into this world so full of corruption and death. Whatever time of the day or night, when we get the call, we go.

Puah: I don't know how the Pharaoh found out about us, because we mostly move in circles with other women. But, sure enough, one day, his soldiers were at our door. They said, "You must come with us immediately."

Shiphrah: Naturally, we assumed we were going to be killed, but there was no time to say goodbye.

Puah: When we got to the palace, we were led out of the dust and sun, and into the moist cool inner room. And, there he was, the Pharaoh himself!

Shiphrah: He told us that we must no longer be bringers of life. Instead, he instructed us to kill the children before they even arrived. And he did not kill us. He let us go, to be his agents of death.

Puah: By the way he commanded it, we realized the Pharaoh didn't understand very much about how babies are born.

Shiphrah: So we nodded and agreed, knowing in our hearts that we would never do as he said.

Puah: Instead, we went on helping the women when the birth pangs came. And some mothers died, and some babies too, but most of them lived.

Shiphrah: Later, when he asked us about this, we said, Life is too vigorous to be put down so easily. Now our people are stronger than ever.

Puah: And because we followed the way of life, not the way of death, so are we.
