 $\mathbf{F}$  or Children: We have trained nursery staff (paid nursery attendant as well as adult volunteers) for ages 0-4. The nursery is located on the first floor outside of the Community Room. **Postlude** (remain seated)

We welcome UCC General Minister and President, The Rev. Dr. John Dorhaeur, to our worship this morning. The Rev. Dr. Dorhauer, author and theologian, currently serves as ninth General Minister and President of the United Church of Christ.

John began his ministry serving Zion United Church of Christ and First Congregational United Church of Christ in rural Missouri. He then served as Associate Conference Minister in the Missouri Mid-South Conference, followed by Conference Minister of the Southwest Conference.

Dorhauer received a B.A. in Philosophy from Cardinal Glennon College and has a Master of Divinity degree from Eden Theological Seminary. John received a Doctor of Ministry degree from United Theological Seminary, studying White Privilege and Its Effect on the Church.

With a personal theology shaped in the passionate conviction that God is love and God is just, John has embodied the United Church of Christ's vision of "A Just World for All" throughout his ministry. John initiated the collaborative creation of a

curriculum, "White Privilege: Let's Talk – A Resource for Transformational Dialogue". Designed to invite UCC members and others to engage in safe, meaningful, substantive, and bold conversations on race, the curriculum and accompanying facilitator's guide have been used by both UCC and non-UCC audiences. It has since been translated into German for use by our partners in Germany as they struggle with a rising tide of racism and seek to learn more about the manifestations of white privilege in their cultural context.

In addition, John has partnered with the UCC Board of Directors in providing oversight for the articulation of the denomination's statements of Purpose, Vision and Mission – critical elements for the UCC's evolving organizational strategy. In partnership with the UCC Board of Directors – and informed with responses from across the church to the question "what does a transformative UCC need to be in ten years?"– John has called the church to accomplish essential strategic priorities over the next 10 years to position the church for a transformative future. More recently, recognizing a need for thought leadership to consider, inform and shape our responsibility for lifelong, cradle-to-the-grave theological formation, John called for a summit on theological formation, From the Ground Up. John recently oversaw the launch of a Research and Development office in the National Setting. Its purpose is to coach innovation, identify places where creative leaders are architecting and birthing new pathways for evangelism, and providing critical data on what is working and why.

John insists that the Holy Spirit envisions a future in which the United Church of Christ matters. He is calling on the denomination to rethink itself and to consider new ways of being church in light of institutional religion's changing landscape, emerging shifts in the generational populations, and life after COVID. John's book Beyond Resistance: The Institutional Church Meets the Postmodern World is a call to the body of Christ to accept what the Spirit of the Risen Christ is doing to birth something new, vital, and relevant – all towards nurturing the Beloved Community. John married Mimi in 1984. They have co-parented three amazing children and they now both enjoy time with two beautiful grandchildren.

### A Wise Reign Thanksgiving Sunday

Jesus talked about money more than any other topic. Eleven of his forty parables were about money and he talked more about money than faith and prayer combined. Why was money so important to Jesus? Because he knew and preached the truth that how we earn, save, and spend our money is one of the most telling markers of our spiritual life.

Since 1993, The United Church of Christ Cornerstone Fund (https://www.cornerstonefund.org/) has helped to bring Jesus's words to life for congregations and individuals. According to their website, the UCC Cornerstone Fund "helps local churches and non-profit organizations create change within their communities. And we're building transformative products that not only empower these communities, but also help our clients earn even more on their investments."

Founded in 1993 as a 501(c)3 non-profit organization, the UCC Cornerstone Fund holds more than \$100 million dollars in total assets with a total of 3000+ investors. In just a few decades, they have financed more than 650 projects worth more than \$275,000,000 across the United States. They champion green building, supporting projects that save more than 350,000 kWh in energy usage per year. And they help churches save \$3.1 million every year with their refinancing programs.

The website of the Cornerstone Fund (https://www.cornerstonefund.org/) offers a wealth of free advice on conscious investing, funding college education and more. There are stories there, too, about churches that have been helped by the Cornerstone Fund to breathe new life into their structures and ministries.
