

Thank you for worshiping with us this morning. We extend a special welcome to our guests.

For Children: We have trained nursery staff (paid nursery attendant as well as adult volunteers) for ages 0-4. The nursery is located on the first floor outside of the Community Room. (Accessible by the stairs from the Church Street Entrance or via the elevator). Children ages 5 and above are invited to stay and worship with their families. Children's



programs, books, and crayons are located in the rear of the sanctuary near the welcome table.

If you are visiting and did not stop at the welcome desk in the downstairs lobby please stop by after the service they would love to meet you or, please feel free to reach out to someone sitting near you and ask them questions about the service or church. Many of our visitors ask us about the time of offering. This is a time in our service when we respond to God's gifts of love by offering the gifts of our lives. We also use this time to ask God how we might use the gifts of our hands and hearts in sharing God's love. If you are visiting, there is no obligation to give a financial gift. We are just glad you are worshiping with us. At this time, we are taking offering at the end of the service. Plates for offering will be placed at the doors as you exit the sanctuary. Thank you.

We ask that you please silence your cell phones during our worship service. We also ask that you refrain from applause after our choirs sing and allow the music to resonate in the quiet of the sanctuary and in your hearts. Our musicians are playing and singing for the glory of God. They know you appreciate their efforts and their gift.


*Opening Prayer

Communion Prayer

Through all the seasons and changes of our lives there is one that stands above all others: this Season of Easter, in which we celebrate with unbridled joy the presence of the risen and living Christ in our midst.

No matter where we have been, or where we find ourselves today, we are bold to gather in joy knowing that our living is tied up with that of Christ who lives forever.

With joy we gather at this sacred table to be sacred community: to be the people called by God into new and everlasting life.

We celebrate the joyous opportunity to share good news with all the world: that Christ's resurrection is for all people, that God's love is for all people, that this table and this fear are for all people.

We take this simple cup, and as it is lifted up we think of Jesus' words: "Take and drink; this is my blood, poured out for you and many for the forgiveness of sin."

It is poured out that we may know ourselves forgiven.

We know that in this meal we are gathered by a great community that has gone before us. We are bold to gather at this table with Thomas, and Lydia, with Paul and Ananias, and all those men and women who dared to join with one another in those first days, and boldly remember the presence of the living Christ in their midst. Bless us now in the sharing of this meal, that we may be enlivened to share your gifts with those who hunger and thirst for acceptance, for new life, for wholeness.

This morning we will bring communion to the congregation as you are seated in the pews. Please hold the bread until all have been served and the pastors extend the invitation for all to eat. Please hold the cup of grape juice until all have been served and the pastors extend the invitation for all to drink. In this way, we can commune together.

Loving God, you have gathered us here out of love for you, and reminded us at this table that we are one people. Send us out, now, into a hurting world to share the good news that Christ is alive for all people. Amen.

May 1, 2022 Acts 9:1-6

The Way Forward

Saul, the persecutor of God's people became Paul, champion of the living Christ, after a powerful singular experience on the road to Damascus. For Silver Lake Award honoree Valerie Tutson, the powerful, singular moment that Christ came alive for her was not on the road, but in the pews of her childhood church.

Valerie Tutson is a storyteller by trade and her eyes widen with joy when she tells the story of the first time she saw a performance by some of her church friends after they returned from a camp experience at Silver Lake Conference Center (SLCC), a United Church of Christ facility. She recounts that in seeing those young women - dressed in plastic garbage bags meant to represent frog costumes and singing about the plagues and pharaoh - her life was changed forever. From then on, scripture stories were not merely words on the page, but a living breathing story, one that became hers to tell with creativity and wonder. After that she attended camp as soon, and as often, as she could.

"Silver Lake has been a part of my life since I was 11 years old," Val said. "Without a doubt, Silver Lake has helped to shape the person I am in the world. It has always been a place where my life, my creative work, and my faith get explored and braided together. I tell people all over the world that all the good stuff I learned about life and caring for God's people I learned and keep learning at camp!" She has been a camper or staff member of the camp since 1977.

SLCC Executive Director, the Rev. Ryan Gackenheimer, says that even many decades after her "come to Jesus moment" in the pews of her home church, "It is difficult to be in the presence of Val and not know that God is alive and loves you to the deepest core of who you truly are."

Do you have a "road to Damascus" moment? How does it continue to inform your life to this day?
