Thank you for worshiping with us this morning. We extend a special welcome to our guests.

**All: In company with all who hunger for spiritual food, we come to this table to know the risen Christ in the sharing of this life-giving bread.**

### **Communion Prayer**

Leader: Let us give thanks to God Most High.

**All: It is right to give God thanks and praise.**
