

Thank you for worshiping with us this morning. We extend a special welcome to our guests.

For Children: We have trained nursery staff (paid nursery attendant as well as adult volunteers) for ages 0-4. The nursery is located on the first floor outside of the Community Room. (Accessible by the stairs from the Church Street Entrance or via the elevator). Children ages 5 and above are invited to stay and worship with their families. Children's programs, books, and crayons are located in the rear of the sanctuary near the welcome table.

Hymn selections can be found in the black hymnals in the pew racks or printed in the bulletin. If you are visiting and did not stop at the welcome desk in the downstairs lobby please stop by after the service they would love to meet you or, please feel free to reach out to someone sitting near you and ask them questions about the service or church. Many of our visitors ask us about the time of offering. This is a time in our service when we respond to God's gifts of love by offering the gifts of our lives. For many of us, this is when we make a financial gift towards the ministries and programs of our church. We also use this time to ask God how we might use the gifts of our hands and hearts in sharing God's love. If you are visiting, there is no obligation to give a financial gift. We are just glad you are worshiping with us. At this time, we are taking offering at the end of the service. Plates for offering will be placed at the doors as you exit the sanctuary. Thank you.

We ask that you please silence your cell phones during our worship service. We also ask that you refrain from applause after our choirs sing and allow the music to resonate in the quiet of the sanctuary and in your hearts. Our musicians are playing and singing for the glory of God. They know you appreciate their efforts and their gift.

Rest rooms (equipped with changing stations) are located on the first floor of the church building and outside the Community Room and the Nursery.

Communion Prayer

Through all the seasons and changes of our lives there is one that stands above all others: this Season of Easter, in which we celebrate with unbridled joy the presence of the risen and living Christ in our midst.

No matter where we have been, or where we find ourselves today, we are bold to gather in joy knowing that our living is tied up with that of Christ who lives forever.

With joy we gather at this sacred table to be sacred community: to be the people called by God into new and everlasting life.

We celebrate the joyous opportunity to share good news with all the world: that Christ's resurrection is for all people, that God's love is for all people, that this table and this fear are for all people.

We remember Jesus gathering with his closest friends yet knowing they would scatter, leaving him alone. Still, he gathered with them and shared this simple meal, taking bread and wine and infusing them with new life; taking ordinary things and making them extraordinary in their new use.

And so we take the ordinary – bread and juice – and make it extraordinary by offering it to you.

We take this simple bread, and as it is broken we think of Jesus' words: "Take and eat; this is my body broken for you."

It is broken that we may live in fullness and wholeness.

We take this simple cup, and as it is lifted up we think of Jesus' words: "Take and drink; this is my blood, poured out for you and many for the forgiveness of sin."

It is poured out that we may know ourselves forgiven.

We know that in this meal we are gathered by a great community that has gone before us.

Sharing of the Bread and Cup

Bless us now in the sharing of this meal, that we may be enlivened to share your gifts with those who hunger and thirst for acceptance, for new life, for wholeness.

All who desire the Sacrament, including children, are invited to come forward at the direction of the deacons. You may kneel or stand to receive the elements. Consume the bread and drink from the cup as it is given to you, and hand your empty cup to one of the ushers.

Prayer of Thanksgiving

Loving God, you have gathered us out of love for you, and reminded us at this table that we are one people. Send us out, now, into a hurting world to share the good news that Christ is alive for all people. Amen.



Worship Next Week: Sixth Sunday of Easter

In 1 Peter 2:2–10, the readers are thought to have been Gentiles who became followers of Jesus. They are scattered throughout the lands of the Mediterranean and Aegean Seas under the rule of the Roman empire and its culture. This letter aspires to guide and inspire them in their daily lives as they are grown into the ways of being God's own people, recipients of God's mercy and inclusion. The language/theme of rocks/stones continues through this passage with Christ being portrayed as both a precious cornerstone for those who trust in him and as a stumbling block to those who don't. This theme connects in part to today's gospel reading, John 14:1–14. Jesus, as part of his farewell discourse before betrayal and execution, speaks words of reassurance to his disciples.

We will be sharing communion this morning. The Senior Choir will be singing. The annual meeting of the congregation will be held in the Community Room / Zoom following worship.

PERIOD PACKS (MENSTRUAL HYGIENE KITS) SERVICE PROJECT May 14 – June 18

Beginning this Mother's Day, May 14, ERUCC will officially launch a campaign to create period packs to help people in period poverty. These kits promote cleanliness and health

during the menstrual cycle. In partnership with Church World Service, the UCC is working provide as many period packs as possible by the end of July as a General Synod service project. Our target date to assemble packs at ERUCC is Father's Day, June 18.

"Period poverty" is defined as a lack of access to menstrual products, hygiene facilities, waste management, and related education. This can result in missed days at school and



work, discrimination, and social isolation. Recent research reveals that almost two-thirds of women in the U.S. with a low income could not afford menstrual products in the last year, while nearly half had to choose between food and menstrual products.

Needed donation items include the following:

- Regular and super-absorbency tampons
- Sanitary pads (unscented, long, super, ultra-thin)
- Bath-size soaps (3oz. bar or larger, no Ivory or Jergen's soap. Do not remove packaging)
- Packs of flushable wipes (unscented 42-count)

Drop-off bins are located outside the sanctuary and Trinity Chapel. Financial donations directed to ERUCC should note that they are for the "Period Packs Project."



When we chose the site for the garden, everything was dormant, and we didn't realize that Bermuda/wiregrass covered four fifths of the area to be converted to gardens. This is very invasive and difficult to kill. The non-toxic approach isn't working.

In order to move forward, I need to remove 4-5" of hardwood mulch and take up the remains of cardboard underneath. This will require shovels, pronged rakes, and wheelbarrows.


