## **Today at ERUCC**

Today, Holy Humor Sunday, celebrates Jesus' resurrection on the Sunday after Easter. For centuries in Eastern Orthodox, Catholic, and Protestant countries, the week following Easter Sunday, including "Bright Sunday" (the Sunday after Easter), was observed by the faithful as "days of joy and laughter" with parties and picnics to celebrate Jesus' resurrection.

The custom was rooted in the musings of early church theologians (like Augustine, Gregory of Nyssa, and John Chrysostom) that God played a practical joke on the devil by raising Jesus from the dead. "Risus paschalis - the Easter laugh," the early theologians called it.

Be prepared to make a joyful noise. Celebrate the gift of new life in Christ. Christ is risen, risen indeed.

#### LET'S TALK: BOOK STUDY OF *CASTE* led by The Rev. Richard Leslie and Peter Brehm Sundays, April 7, 14, 21, 28 Community Room 9:30 – 10:15 AM

Richard Leslie and Peter Brehm will co-lead a study of the book *Caste* by Isabelle Wilkerson for four Sundays in April. Participating in this class will offer many "ah-ha moments," maybe some discomfort and lots of opportunity for discussion and reflection.

In Caste, Isabel Wilkerson gives us a masterful portrait of an unseen phenomenon in America as she explores, through an immersive, deeply researched, and beautifully written narrative and stories about real people, how America today and throughout its history has been shaped by a hidden caste system, a rigid hierarchy of human rankings.

Participants are encouraged to read as much of the first one hundred pages as possible before the first class.

Like the Sunday morning class, this evening class offers an opportunity to read and discuss the scriptures, looking at them in their original context, considering when and by whom they were written, and how they have been interpreted through the centuries. All you need is a Bible; no prior knowledge is necessary.

#### JUNIOR CHURCH



Today you are invited into the story of Thomas. Whether it is new to you or very familiar, take a few moments to read his story in the book of John. Sit with one or more of these questions. What words, phrases, or ideas jump out at you? What seems comforting? What is unsettling? What about this story stands the test of time? What part of this story seems better left in the past? What is God calling you to, using this story?

Although he is sometimes called "Doubting Thomas," the disciple's willingness to ask questions does not show doubt but in fact its opposite; curiosity and a deep desire to experience the risen Christ using all his senses. This post-Easter impulse, to deeply know the risen Christ however one can, is at the heart of the United Church of Christ's Science and Technology Network.

The Network is guided by the Pastoral Letter on Faith and Science, an epistle that turns twenty-five years old this year. Some issues, like the rise of the use of AI, for example, and a more global awareness of the seriousness of climate change, are new. But the questions the Pastoral Letter on Faith and Science asks are just as salient today as they were two and half decades ago.
