We also ask that you refrain from applause after our choirs sing and allow the music to resonate in the quiet of the sanctuary and in your hearts. Our musicians are playing and singing for the glory of God. They know you appreciate their efforts and their gift.

Restrooms (accessible and equipped with changing stations) are located on the 2nd floor, below the sanctuary, and on the 1st floor, outside the Community Room. Single-occupant, genderneutral, accessible restrooms are located outside the North and Flora Rooms on the 2nd floor.

Psalm 84 | John 6:56-69

Together, this week's readings remind us of the mutual indwelling of God in us and us in God. Psalm 84 celebrates the temple as a dwelling place for God. "How lovely is your dwelling place" sing the pilgrims as they enter the temple in Jerusalem. They have reached this place of prayer, preparation, and sustenance. In John 6:56–69, Jesus' own disciples seem to be offended by his teachings, yet Peter recognizes that in Jesus is the "Holy One of God." In Christ, a dwelling place of God, they have found their home and strength to go on when others have turned back.

The Rev. Kirstin Shrom-Rhoads will preach and lead worship. We will also honor the milestone ordination anniversaries of Rev. Fred Wenner, Rev. Robert Manthey, Rev. Kirstin Shrom-Rhoads, and, posthumously, Rev. Dr. Gerry Hanberry.

MISSION TRIP TO BERKS COUNTY, PA

October 6 - 11

Exciting news from the Mission, Evangelism, and Social Justice Team! We've been given the green light for a mission trip in Berks County, Pennsylvania, from October 6-11, 2024.

In June of 2023, a devastating flash flood wreaked havoc on Alsace Township and the surrounding areas in Berks County. The aftermath left homes, businesses, schools, and roads severely damaged. Despite the damages, they were denied state and federal aid, leaving many without the resources to rebuild. Local churches and civic organizations have stepped up to meet the needs of this community.

Now, we have a chance to make a real difference. With leadership from the Pennsylvania Southeast Conference UCC's Disaster Ministries, we have been called to the area to lend a hand. Our base will be at The Bridge Fellowship Church in Reading, PA, where comfortable accommodations await us in men's and women's bunk rooms. Plus, there's full access to kitchen facilities and bathrooms with showers.

Our work will be coordinated through Lutheran Disaster Ministries and focuses on home restoration tasks like drywalling, woodworking, flooring, and painting. Don't worry if you're not a pro—every skill level is welcome! We'll have a construction coordinator onsite to guide us and a tool trailer stocked with everything we need.

This is an opportunity to do meaningful work and connect with a community in need.

ERUCC COLLECTS ITEMS FOR FREDERICK FOODBANK YEAR-ROUND

Remember! ERUCC collects items for the City of Frederick Foodbank, operated by the Department of Housing & Human Services. The foodbank provides a three—to five-day supply of food to individuals and families facing an economic crisis who cannot afford to buy their groceries. The City operates two locations, serving between 600 and 800 households each month.

You can find donation baskets in the Trinity Chapel narthex and the Main Sanctuary narthex every week. The Foodbank accepts a wide range of donations, including non-perishable food items such as:

- Breakfast cereals
- Canned fruits
- Canned meats
- Canned vegetables

- Pasta
- Rice
- Other staple items (home canned foods cannot be accepted)
